

Applications open: May – July Deadlines: July – September

# Spring Internships (January - May):



Applications open: **September – November**Deadlines: **November – December** 

# Summer Internships (May - August):



Applications open:

September – February
Deadlines: December –
March

### Maxwell in DC (happens every semester)

Undergraduate Semester provides the opportunity to engage critically important institutions, processes, and policymakers while living in the nation's capital. Outside of the classroom, you can gain first hand experience in public or international affairs by interning three to five days per week.

#### Albany Immersion Experience (1 Day Trip on March 28)

The immersion trip consists of an all-day experience with local agencies and government offices across varying professional sectors in downtown Albany, NY. The event will also include networking dinner with Syracuse University alumni working in various fields in government.

premiere certification organization. Maxwell will pay for the test.


## **Economics at SU by the Numbers**

Number of graduates from the economics department in the past three years




## **Economics at SU by the Numbers**

# First Destination Survey Insights



### **Industry Placement**

- 15.18% work for Financial Service companies,
- 7.33% work for Sports and Leisure companies
- 6.81% work for Internet and Software companies
- 5.71% work Investment Banking companies



### **Types of Jobs**

- 28.68% have Finance positions
- 16.28% have Data & Analytics positions
- 10.85% work in Consulting
- 10.08% work in Sales.



### **Geographical Placement**

47.89% of those working stayed in New York, 8.45% moved to Maryland, and 7% moved to California



### **Alumni's Companies**

Alumni's found jobs at Ernst & Young, Goldin Solutions, Goldman Sachs, KPMG, JP Morgan Chase, LogixHealth, Morgan Stanley, Wells Fargo and many more

# First Destination Survey Insights



### Types of continuing education

Out of those seeking a continuing education 91.16% are seeking a Masters and 6.8% went on to a Doctorate program



### **Masters Programs**

For those seeking Masters: 34.33% continued at Syracuse University, 8.21% went to Johns Hopkins University, and 3.73% went to Columbia University





### **Doctorate Programs**

Those who are seeking a Doctorate went on to Universities including George Washington University, University of Notre Dame, University of Florida, Temple University, and UC Irvine





# **Resume Tips**

- → Keep it **one page** (unless extensive experience)
- → Use strong action verbs (e.g., "Led," "Developed," "Analyzed")
- → **Tailor** your resume to each internship description
- → Highlight relevant skills, coursework, and projects
- → **Proofread** for grammar and formatting errors
- → Check the effectiveness of your resume through VMOCK
- → Watch out for **resume workshops** through clubs and the career center





**Cover Letter Tips** 

- → Address it to a specific person if possible
- → Explain why you're interested in the role and company
- → Highlight key skills and experiences (don't repeat your resume)
- → Keep it concise (3-4 paragraphs max)
- → End with a strong closing statement and a call to action
